

Welcome

Veterinary Instrumentations inaugural Orthopaedic Symposium has been designed to grow both Veterinary and Nursing knowledge within your practice in order to "Do more and treat better."

The Symposium will be split into two streams to support your practice's Orthopaedic knowledge, encompassing both Nursing and Veterinary streams.

The Veterinary stream will incorporate five of Australia's leading Orthopeadic Specialists and CPD presenters. It will explore in depth - the cervical spine, shoulder, elbow and carpus, using both presentation and small group, case-based and scientifically supported discussions.

Incorporating presentations from Orthopaedic Veterinary Specialists, leading Nursing and Surgical Nursing presenters, the Nursing stream will culminate with presentations on managing stress and resilience as a part of your own self-care.



Dr Mark Glyde **BVSc MACVSc MVS HDipUTL DiplomateECVS**

Mark is Associate Professor of Small Animal Surgery at Murdoch University and heads the orthopaedic and neurosurgery referral service.

Mark holds a Masters degree in Veterinary Surgery, is a Member of the Australian College of Veterinary Scientists in small animal surgery, a Diplomate of the European College of Veterinary Surgeons and is an Australian, European and RCVS registered Specialist Small Animal Surgeon.

He is an internationally recognised and awarded teacher with a passion for training veterinary undergraduates and postgraduate veterinarians. His main clinical interests are in small animal lameness, agility and performance / working dogs, minimally invasive orthopaedic surgery, fracture repair, arthroscopy, hip replacements and angular limb deformity correction.

Mark is also the Chair of AOVET Asia Pacific and is on the AOVET International Board and the AOVET Education Commission.

His main research interests are in fracture and implant biomechanics, particularly minimally invasive fracture repair and in veterinary kinetics of agility and sporting dogs.

Locking Plates – Dry Bone Workshop

Locking bone plates are now being used regularly in Veterinary Orthopaedics. They reflect an evolution in the principles of application, design and biomechanics from the traditional dynamic compression plate. They do however carry their own specific principles of application and cannot be treated in the same way a traditional DCP is applied. Understanding your Orthopedic equipment is absolutely critical in maintaining its longevity in clinic and maximising the efficiency and effectiveness of your veterinary nursing team. Veterinary nurses will explore not just how certain instruments are used, but why and when a piece of equipment has reached and exceeded the end of its useful life expectancy. Veterinary nurses will also be given the tools to conduct an equipment audit, ensuring they are able to go straight back into their own clinics and audit their kits looking for the correct signs of usage, wear and damage that indicates a piece of equipment can be repaired, replaced or is okay to continue serving its purpose as a critical member of the surgical team.

Plenary Speaker

Gerrard Gosens OAM

Gerrard Gosens is one of Australia's true high achievers. Gerrard is a totally blind adventurer, three-time Paralympian, Project Manager, Chocolatier and motivational speaker. He is currently aiming to be selected to represent Australia at the 2020/21 Tokyo Paralympic Games.

Gerrard was asked while swimming at his local swimming pool in 2016 if he would like the opportunity to complete a triathlon. Since then, Gerrard has gone on to be ranked inside the top ten Paralympic sprint triathletes in the world. He won bronze at the 2017 World cup, placed ninth at the 2017 World Championships, and in December went the extra distance and won the Paralympic category at the Busselton Ironman. Gerrard continued to develop as a triathlete, winning the 2018 Oceania Triathlon Sprint Championships, and multiple medals at World Cups leading to the Paralympic Games.

Gerrard was honoured with an Order of Australia (OAM) award in 2012, for his outstanding service to sport, and people who are blind or have low vision. He has been awarded the Fervent Global Love of Lives Medal, which has been recognized by the international media as "The Nobel

In 2009, in a television world-first, he faced one of his greatest challenges ever, when he took to the dance floor on" Dancing with the Stars". Gerrard made it to the semifinal despite never having danced a step in his life.

While the show was the first glimpse of this inspirational man for many Australians, corporate audiences have been motivated and uplifted by Gerrard's life story for many years.

Gerrard has run the 2,000 kilometers from Cairns to Brisbane five times to raise money for charity. He represented Australia at the 1996 Atlanta Paralympic Games in the team sport of Goalball. Gerrard returned to his former sporting love – distance running and represented Australia at the Sydney 2000 Paralympic Games in the 5000 metres, 10,000 meters and marathon (42.2km). He has gone on to represent Australia at the 2008 Beijing Paralympic games, six Athletics World Championships, and 2012 Marathon World Cup.

Gerrard also has a head for heights! He has, three times, co-piloted an ultra-light motor glider around Queensland to raise funds for charity.





Gerrard believes in preparation! During 2003 / 2004 he spent many weeks at Everest Base Camp and high altitudes in the Himalayas. He returned to Everest in 2005 and climbed to 8300m.

His many achievements; strength and determination to succeed at whatever he sets his mind to, saw him named Young Queenslander of the Year, and a finalist in the Young Australian of the Year.


Gerrard was awarded the Melvin Jones Fellowship for humanitarian service, and in 2003 received a Centenary of Federation Medal for service to sport.

Gerrard is the owner of the business called Chocolate Moments, creating their own hand-made chocolates while running two retail chocolate stores in Brisbane and conducting chocolate cooking experiences.

In addition to his full-time job as a Project Manager, business venture as the world's first blind Chocolatier, and owner of Chocolate Moments, sporting and adventure pursuits, Gerrard is writing a book called "My Eyes had a Wet Nose", which provides an insight into the many unique and entertaining experiences that he has encountered with his guide dogs, Joey, Anchor, Summit, Chief, and now Boss.

Gerrard said "Everything I've done and everything I've achieved has been made possible through the support, assistance and commitment of a dedicated team of people who have been beside me, no matter how difficult, dangerous or crazy the dream. "I've always believed that success is a journey, not a destination.
